Don, Angelia and Ryan Cribb—What excites Don most about FPC is to see God's work and the enthusiasm that has grown in the 9:00am service. His favorite ice cream butter pecan (pick-AHN). For fun he likes playing music



and his hero is Dabo Swinney. Don's favorite scripture is 2 Corinthians 5:17 "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come. The old is gone, the new is here!" Because God made even a wretch like me into a new creation through Christ.

"My extraordinary and wonderful wife introduced me to this verse about six and a half years ago. It was painted on a canvas by a friend of ours and hangs over our daughter's bed and Pastor Timothy used it for my father's funeral service. I just love the though of God rejoicing and singing over us and calming us with his love. It's hard for me to picture anything other than a loving grandparent rocking their grandchild, singing a sweet song as the child drifts off to sleep."

Rebecca is most excited about children and youth ministries and outreach opportunities. "We have been blessed to have been welcomed into the music ministry and church!" Her favorite ice cream is cookie dough. For fun she loves to listen to music, read poetry, paint stuff (not artistically, but like walls, cabinets, and furniture). She does Harry Potter yoga with Sarah (yes, it's a real thing), and looks to the sky for God's paintings. Rebecca's hero is her Memaw. "Memaw was my grandmother, my mom's mom. She loved Troy. I loved all my grandparents, but Memaw's no-nonsense, practical, sharp as a tack wisdom, was able to penetrate my thick skull and soften the hardest of heads. She was the epitome of tough love. Her favorite poem was The House by the Side of the Road by Sam Walter Foss. She truly was a friend to all. She took care of people in ways they didn't know they needed. She was a woman of few words but with such power in the words she did choose." My favorite scripture is the story of the Samaritan woman at the well in John 4. Jesus shocked this woman by asking her for a drink of water, and as a result, she engaged in respectful conversation with a stranger and enemy, a Jewish man, and she asked insightful questions during a time when no value was placed on women's education or testimony. This woman was a victim of horribly unjust marriage practices of the day, where a woman's economic survival was dependent on her status as a wife and producer of male heirs. Perhaps she suffered multiple deaths of her husbands or divorce due to barrenness. Jesus recognized her homelessness, her loneliness, her displacement, her poverty, her traumatic circumstances, yet still her longing for restoration. He came to the well that day to make her His bride, not unlike the church. This woman

believed in her inheritance and when she declared her faith in the Messiah, she became the first person Jesus revealed His identity to. She left her water jar and went and told all the towns people right away. I believe the reason the towns people immediately believed her about Jesus is because people know those who have suffered greatly won't falsely proclaim the Messiah. Prior to her meeting with Jesus, this woman had no value to society, not as a wife, not as a mother, but Jesus showed her what He saw in her. Jesus showed her He valued her simply by asking her to meet His need with a drink of water. And as a result, she gave her life for Him and many came to believe.

Sarah likes that FPC teaches about God and she loves Sunday School. Her favorite ice cream is chocolate and vanilla. For fun, she likes to paint and play. Her hero is God and Jesus because when you are sad they help you be happy. Sarah's favorite Bible story is when Jesus died for our sins because if he hadn't we would never be happy.

What is Confirmation?

The short answer to that question is that it is simply a period of intentional reflection that usually takes place at some point during the teenage years. A life of faith is one in which we wrestle with big questions, including questions of who we are, who God is, and how the two intersect and exist in, and with, each other. Reflection is necessary throughout our life as we deal with this foundational search for meaning.

When is Confirmation?

Three Sunday nights: April 29th, May 6th, and May 20th, from 6:00pm -8:00pm. Students are only allowed to miss one of the three classes to qualify for confirmation. We will have a service on Sunday morning, June 3rd to present the confirmands at 11am.

What if I am not Baptized?

In the Presbyterian Church, like other denominations, we believe that infant baptism is a declaration that we will raise a child in the church and points to the day that you will declare your faith as your own. Confirmation looks back at your infant baptism and reflects on how that has now become your own. If you have not been baptized as an infant, no need to worry. After confirmation service on June 3rd, we will have a picnic at Sommerset and some baptisms at the lake.

NOTE YOUTH DO NOT HAVE TO WHITEWATER RAFT TO GO, there are plenty of other things for youth to do and still come!




