And who knows but that you have come to your position for such a time as this? -Esther 4:14

On behalf of the Session of First Presbyterian Church, I have the tremendous joy and privilege of introducing you to our new Director of Spiritual Formation – Angeline Harris Brock!

I feel a little silly introducing you to Angeline, since she was raised in this church—baptized as an infant and grew up as a LOGOS student and youth in our church. However, it's a rare gift when the church can raise up one of her own to be a leader. And a leader she has been for the last 3 years.

After returning home from USC, Angeline began volunteering at our church and feeling the gradual and gentle tug toward ministry. She worked with the youth and children's ministries, all while managing *Versona*, a fashion retailer in Mt. Pleasant. This experience inside and outside of the church opened up Angeline's shepherding heart to the spiritual needs of those around her. In 2015, her sense

of call became a little clearer when she started serving on the newly formed Mission Ministry Team at FPC. She was exposed to mission partners in Ethiopia, Mexico, and right here in the Lowcountry. She knew she wanted to serve God, it was now a matter of where and in what capacity. So, in January of 2018, she approached the leadership of our church to help her discern a more formal call to ministry. A team of leaders—Jesse Cannon, John O. Williams, Rin Page, Lyndsay Baruch, and I—met, prayed, and dreamed of what God might be stirring in the areas of outreach, evangelism, and women's ministry for her. At the time, we didn't have the resources to take on additional staff. Little did we know the opening God would provide here at our own church.

Therefore, when David announced that he and Lyndsay were being called to plant a church in St. Louis, God not only opened a

door for the Baruchs, He also opened a door for the Brocks. The session has felt God's Spirit and timing throughout these conversations. We were all joyfully surprised that we could receive David's resignation and hire Angeline at the same session meeting. I knew the Spirit could move fast, but that might be a record for Presbyterians. Therefore, we can confidently say that God has been preparing Angeline "for such a time as this" (which happens to be her favorite Bible verse).

That quotation comes at a time when God is calling Esther to sacrificially leverage her position for the good of her people. When I asked Angeline why she liked (continued on page 2)

it, she responded, "Everyone is invited to participate in God's Kingdom. So, the question becomes what part of the Kingdom has God entrusted to you and whether you'll step into it." We are delighted that Angeline is stepping in and serving in a way that calls all of us to step in.

Angeline will have all the same responsibilities as David, except for liturgy and preaching. We don't expect her to fill David's shoes—he's 6'5"—rather, we anticipate God to continue to equip Angeline and work her to further God's mission here to make disciples who reach UP, IN, and OUT. Again, we see God's grace here, because she has shadowed almost every area of David's ministry—Youth, LOGOS, and Missional Communities.

She will officially start on July 1. The elders are pleased with this overlap with David's schedule for two reasons: 1. The youth ministry will continue to thrive even while David is leading the mission team in France, and 2. It will allow for a smooth transition.

I would say join me in welcoming Angeline, but since she's been here, it's more appropriate to say... join me in celebrating God's providential call—the work of the Holy Spirit in Angeline and our church to bring us to "such a time as this!"

Minutes in a Minute

On Monday, May 21st your session:

- Approved the minutes from April 16th
- Received Frannie Wood's resignation from the Diaconate as her family relocates to Georgia
- Approved the infant baptism of LaNelle, daughter of David and Rebecca Riley for July 8th
- Received David Baruch's resignation as Director of Spiritual Formation effective August 5th
- Approved the Baruchs to support raise for their church plant within the congregation
- Approved hiring Angeline Harris Brock as the Director of Spiritual Formation and appointed Jane Hood (Chair of Stewardship, Personnel, and Finance), Eric Buitenhuis (Chair of Christian Education), and Rev. Scoonover to determine compensation and start date not to exceed the 2018 budget
- Received written reports from the Diaconate, the 9am Worship Service Task Force, and all ministry teams and received an oral report and update from Rev. Scoonover on his Doctor of Ministry studies

The next session meeting will be a special meeting for the purpose of receiving confirmands as new members on Sunday, June 3 at 9am. The session will also have a strategic planning meeting on Sunday, June 10 from 2-4pm. These meeting will take the place of the June Stated Meeting.

Moment for Missions

"Back To School" this fall will mean "Back to LOGOS" for our K5-5th graders.

LOGOS is a midweek time set aside for our congregation to take part in the development of our young people, to build relationships with them, and to become disciples of Jesus along side them.

With LOGOS, we spend our Wednesdays like the early church. In Acts 2:42, we see the early church "Devoted themselves to the apostles teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." LOGOS consists of the same elements: Bible study, play time/activities, worship, and family supper time. These four elements combined allow space for our children and adults to participate in and understand what it is to be living in a Christian community.


