A word from Jane Hood, Chair of the Stewardship Campaign...

Stewardship: "The responsible overseeing and protection of something considered worth caring for and preserving." (dictionary.com)

"Worth caring for and protecting" – **definitely our church!**

October is the season when we begin to develop our plans for the next year, and these plans include our financial plans. We presented a balanced budget to the congregation for 2018, and that is our plan for 2019 as well.

Our budget for 2018 is \$433,900, and we are on track to meet that target and cover all our expenses. In 2019, the Stewardship, Personnel and Finance Ministry Team has proposed a budget of \$453,200. What does this mean? A proposed budget is everything we would like to accomplish in 2019, including absorbing the costs of operating our church, which increase every year.

Let's look at what our budget covers:

- Personnel 60%
- Operations 25%
- Mission 6%
- Programming and Ministries 7%
- Other 2% (This is primarily expenses associated with our membership in the Charleston Atlantic Presbytery)

You will see that many of our expenses are <u>inward focused</u>—salaries, operations, and program support, and many of these costs increase every year, just as the cost of living increases.

In 2019, our goal is to take a step OUT—to increase our mission giving. The most significant area where we have increased our budget, accounting for \$10,000 of the almost \$20,000 increase for 2019, is mission. This is still only 6% of our total budget, and an area that many of us in church leadership have wanted to see grow as our church grows. This is the area where we propose the largest increase in spending. Following is a recent history of mission spending at our church, and where we would like to go......

The Mission and Evangelism Ministry Team began in 2015. At that time, we set a goal of intentionally supporting evangelism, mercy, and justice in local, regional, and international contexts. Other than Thornwell's Building Families program, our budgeted funding level has remained essentially constant ever since, with inherited built-in line items including Habitat for Humanity, the food pantry, Hope Repairs, Presbyterian Homes of South Carolina, Thornwell, etc.

Meanwhile, the Lord has worked through our members to establish (continued on page 2)



mission partnerships in Mexico and France, thanks largely to your generous support of our short term international missionaries outside the budget, bringing total missions support to approximately 16% of current spending. Being a part of the Lord's work in this way has been very exciting, and we're encouraged to think of how God is using us and shaping us through these efforts. However, up to now this growth hasn't been as comprehensive as we might have wished, and for good reason: for a church of our size, it is difficult to provide intentional, meaningful support for mission partnerships in the evangelism, mercy, and justice categories at each of the local, regional, and international levels. In particular, previously we've been able to provide little support for "regional" mission partnerships (i.e., domestic mission outside of the Charleston area).

To this end, the Mission and Evangelism Ministry Team has requested an additional \$10,000 for 2019, to support a long-term plan to facilitate domestic and international church planting efforts - other line items in the Mission budget will remain unchanged. Plans are for the \$10,000 to be spent supporting domestic and international church plants according to the following 5-year schedule:


- Year 1: \$10,000 domestic plant, \$0 international plant
- Year 2: \$8,000 domestic plant, \$2,000 international plant
- Year 3: \$6,000 domestic plant, \$4,000 international plant
- Year 4: \$4,000 domestic plant, \$6,000 international plant
- Year 5: \$2,000 domestic plant, \$8,000 international plant

We'll select a new domestic church plant to support every five years. Joe Yu will help us find church planters in the developing world for whom this level of funding will provide a great deal of support. This will help us meet the goal of establishing regional and international mission partners who will conduct ministries of evangelism, mercy, and justice in their local contexts. We believe that support for church planting will provide the ability to more efficiently select mission partners and develop longer-term relationships with them, through local church bodies, rather than attempting to do so by selecting individual evangelism, mercy, and justice ministries as partners while – by necessity – providing each of them lower levels of support.

It is exciting to see our church grow and introduce more people to Christ! Please prayerfully consider what you can do to participate in His growing kingdom through First Presbyterian Church. Please make a commitment for 2018, or increase your current commitment to support our growing work in God's mission!

Our church has been collecting shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child for many years. We have many ways to express our feeling for missions, now, but we still include these Christmas gifts as one way to reach children and whole families who have never heard the gospel. This is a very meaningful way for our children to learn how to express God's love for all the world.

Katie Garrett, missionary in Senegal, has provided some advice about shoeboxes from what she has experienced.

Great Gifts: jump ropes, band-aids, hair elastics or head bands for girls, marbles, harmonica, a simple watch for older kids, a solar calculator for older kids, sunglasses for older kids, socks, youngest girls, a baby doll with light brown skin and no hair, toy car, truck or airplane for young boys. (The ones with bigger wheels that are made for toddlers and are larger than Matchbox size are good. Matchbox wheels are so small, they don't work well in dirt.)

Best Gifts: soccer balls or any ball, small flashlight with batteries, soap AND a plastic soap dish that has a cover, toothbrush in a tooth brush holder, pencils, erasers, colored pencils, and sharpeners for all aged children, good quality pens for ages 10-14 in black, red, green, and blue (the pens from America last much longer).
