We have been given a new partnership with the ministry in France at Champfleuri, offering our youth an opportunity to catch the fire of missions within their hearts. Our partnership with Todd in Mexico has strengthened with continued efforts to send teams to help the beleaguered south of our border. Also new areas of works for justice have been opened through a growing partnership with Doors to Freedom to aid in the rescue and restoration of modern day slaves.



This month we are highlighting some local, national, and global partnerships we made in 2018 and we are praying for each of these partners and our opportunity to continue to work with them in 2019.

With these new avenues of service given to us I feel confident to say that our Lord has seen us fit to continue to fan the fire of the Gospel. Indeed our work will not go without hardships or opposition, for we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but with the principalities and forces of this world. On behalf of Thornwell and the families served with the Building Families Program, I want to thank the congregation and staff of First Presbyterian Church of Moncks Corner for your financial support, prayers, guidance and love over the past 3 years. We have been blessed to be a part of the outreach and



ministry you provide to your community. We have had the pleasure of serving alongside you for 3 years and that service has touched many people in your community with In-Home Family Therapy and Parenting Workshops. As a direct result of your generous gifts, Christ's love was shared with parents as they felt support and guidance and children experienced changes in their family. Your congregation helped bring Hope and Healing to your community and for that we are thankful.

Over the past 2 years, we have experienced a decline in referrals from the Moncks Corner area and an increase in referrals from Summerville and North Charleston. After much prayer and meetings (in Presbyterian fashion) we have decided to move the Building Families office to the future site of the Charleston-Atlantic Presbytery office at the former Park Circle Church. This location works for a couple of reasons. We are moving toward a community and a multiple congregation connection concept so that the Building Families Program can be seen as not just the project of a single congregation. This broader "host site concept" will help with a greater service area, increase the pool of financial support, and increase the number of community connections and referral sources. The North Charleston location also places us within the geographic area of our increased referrals.

We look forward to continuing to serve families in the Lowcountry and will keep you informed of our work and opportunities to serve alongside us as we Build Tomorrows Families Today.


