A Note From Our Pastor

What kind of person are your technology habits making you?

There are amazingly godly ways to use the gift of digital technology and amazingly ungodly ways to use it. Take an honest look at how you're using technology and what kind of God-honoring habits, values, and attitudes about technology we can pass on to our kids or grandkids.

This Spring, Ashley and I will be team-teaching from Andy Crouch's book *The Tech-Wise Family*. In his introduction, Crouch describes this book as, "A ruthless guide to sorting out where technology actually belongs in our homes and lives, and keeping it there."

This article is an invitation to join us! The class will be:

Research-Based: Crouch has partnered with Barna Group to write this text. *The Tech-Wise Family* has been informed by the latest statistics and studies about technology's impact on our lives.

Wisdom-Seeking: There are no "go-to" Bible verses telling us when to turn our cell phones off. I wish it were that easy. There is no simple formula. Our interaction with technology is in the "wisdom" category. It takes discernment. We must go beyond using internet filters and screen-time limits, and seek to build character, courage, and wisdom in us and our children.

Highly-Practical: There will be homework (the good kind) each week. We will actually experiment with his 10 Commitments. Do they work? Is it feasible? Am I seeing a difference?

Grace-Filled: This is not a time to "kick ourselves" for what we *should* have done differently. This is not just another book to make us feel guilty. We're all in this together. Crouch's own teenage daughter, Amy, endorsed the book, "Tech-Wise parenting welcomes the mud, the crayon drawings on the wall, and the arguments, because it takes some messiness to flourish."



One of our Core Values is “Raising the Next Generation for God.”

One way our elders are seeking to embody that core value is to introduce periodic mid-week worship services.

These are worship opportunities for the *ENTIRE congregation* which we have scheduled at peak times that our youth and children are on our church campus.

The goal is to have intergenerational worship – a more full expression of the body of Christ.

This Ash Wednesday service will be our pilot mid-week service. Childcare will be provided for children 5 years old and younger.

Sunday, February 17 and 24, we will have the annual Henry Bonner Memorial offering at First Presbyterian Church of Moncks Corner. Special envelopes will be available for contributions in the pews. All funds collected will go to support the Habitat for Humanity in Berkeley County. Mr. Bonner had a long and distinguished career in public education, serving as a coach, teacher, principal, and eventually, as Superintendent of Schools for Berkeley County in 1959. He served in this position for nearly 30 years, retiring just before Hurricane Hugo in 1989. The Henry E. Bonner Elementary School in Macedonia was named in his honor. After his retirement, he became active as a volunteer in many civic endeavors, and chaired the Habitat for Humanity effort which was just beginning in Berkeley County. Henry died on July 3, 2007. The session wanted to remember Henry in a way that would honor him. Because his influence was so important in getting Habitat for Humanity started in Berkeley County, it was decided that a memorial offering would take place annually in February, with the funds collected designated to support Habitat for Humanity that was so important to Henry.

Over 700 volunteers held hammer walls, install vinyl siding, complete community projects and sort donations in the ReStore. Women Build in May of 2018, was our largest to-date with over 180 women participating!

Lowe’s awarded HFHBC a \$100,000 grant and volunteer support to complete several community based projects. These projects include critical home repairs, a community garden, bus shelters, and health and wellness classes.
