In case you missed it, a note from our church planting partners...

Lyndsay and I have been reflecting on Luke 5. What is interesting in this passage is that Jesus approached Peter, a wealthy experienced fisherman who just finished fishing for the day. It was mid-day, and they toiled all morning and caught nothing. Jesus then says to them

to put out into the deep water and cast their nets down.

Now at first glance it just seems like Jesus is saying, "Hey let's just try casting the nets one more time to see if we then catch anything." But it is much more than this. First off in the Sea of Galilee, you



do not fish in the deep like that; if you fished you would fish in the shallows where the fish gather. Secondly, anyone who fishes knows the best time to fish is in the morning or at dusk. Middle of the day fishing was just foolish.

So when you give some context to what Jesus is asking he is saying go to the deep, (FOOLISH), and also fish mid-day (FOOLISH). What Jesus was asking them to do was complete foolishness in the world's eyes and by the standards of what a fisherman would know to do.

Okay, let's get some more context, this passage is directly related to church growth, building, planting, and evangelism, or however you want to categorize it. The passage is about fishing for people, as later in the passage Jesus says, "Now you will fish for people."

So, what does this mean for a church planter? Lyndsay and I have put ourselves in a very vulnerable position; we have taken a huge risk in our lives, with our family, with our wellbeing, and our careers. We stepped out in faith and did something that to many might seem foolish. We quit our jobs and tried to start something that has no tangible evidence at first, it is a huge risk! And at times we both feel like Peter, we look at Jesus and say, "Okay Lord, we have toiled all day fishing, but if you say put the nets in, if you say be missional, if you say start a church, though it at times seems foolish, and at times we are unsure of how this will come about, because you say so we will put the nets in." We almost do it at times like Peter, with tongue in cheek. It feels scary, and seems foolish, but when we do it this way, look at what happens when the Lord shows up. Peter is humbled in the passage and declares himself a sinner. (continued on page 2)

When we minister in the midst of risk, we are in such a vulnerable place that we in our own power are helpless, the Lord must show up! But when the Lord shows up in this way, I believe it brings him great joy, because he truly receives all the glory, and we are humbled like Peter.

Lyndsay and I dove into a neighborhood and have committed ourselves to a people. We are slowly gathering and meeting people. But we are also very vulnerable, we have to continually remind ourselves that the Spirit of the Lord has gone before us, and he can and will do a supernatural work and bring us a net so full of people we can't haul it into the boat. Do we really believe this?

What does this mean for you? It means that whatever church context you are in, you are called to step out in risk, to take risks, and do things that might seem foolish to the world! But if done with a heart that seeks to bring the gospel to those hurting, to build his church and make disciples, no matter how foolish it may seem, in the midst of risk Jesus will show up!

Be risk takers for Jesus!



Moment for Missions

Our congregation recently had the opportunity and privilege to hear from David and Lyndsay. Each month our Mission Ministry Team looks to highlight prayer requests of one of our mission partners. Lyndsay and David challenged our congregation to pray so each week throughout the month of May. We will lift up specific prayer requests for Three Taverns Community Church. These are requests David and Lyndsay shared in their recent newsletter.

Week 1—Every week we have on several different nights people over to our house for dinner and fellowship. These are people who have welcomed us into their lives, some claim to know Jesus, and some don't but we are beginning to have spiritual conversations around who Jesus is. Please pray for these dinners and those conversations.

Week 2—We are still meeting with about 100 people regularly through various venues and are now beginning to have gatherings at our home. These are social gatherings where people are getting to know one another and us. We pray that these will lead to Bible studies. We have many one-on-one meetings and are doing prediscipleship meetings with people who could potentially be in our core team (we have some event almost every night of the week and give ourselves a day off). Before they join our core team for our church, we understand that they must first learn to trust us. Pray for these continued efforts and pray for the 8 people that we believe God is leading to join that core group.


Week 3—Pray for the moms group Lyndsay is a part of. Several times each week Lyndsay is hanging out with different moms and developing pre-discipleship relationships and creating new friends. Pray for her efforts and that the spirit will go before her and guide the conversations.

Week 4—David has been officially added to the Community Improvement Board for Dutchtown. He will be putting on several big events to build community (example - organizing movies on the lawn for the neighborhood). He will also be overseeing revitalization efforts for the neighborhood and park. This is a big position to get voted into. Please pray that it becomes a vehicle for David to be the hands and feet of Jesus in this neighborhood, make connections, and through this build a church. Pray for these efforts. Jesus opened a huge door with this one!


