Restoration Project

Brothers and Sisters,

As you may know, the Session has approved a Restoration Project for our church. You'll hear more about this project and its different phases in the coming days and weeks, but we'll use this space to give a breakdown of the overall scope of work to be done. We'll also explain a little bit about the issues that exist, how they came to be, and the remedies that we've identified as being the best fixes for the issues. The following order will also be the order in which the work will be done.


Sanctuary Windows:

The windows in the Sanctuary leak and have leaked for years. The Sanctuary was completed in 1996 and the windows began leaking almost immediately. They were replaced by the contractor, Trident Construction, roughly 5 years after construction and through the years they began to leak again. We now know that the window manufacturer, Jeldwen, had a production issue with the particular type of windows that we have. The individual vinyl seals around the individual panes of glass shrink and swell with weather changes and allow for leakage. This helps to explain why all of our leaks are intermittent and seem to "move around" from window to window. We plan to complete the window replacement portion of the Renovation project for \$50,000 or below. We have quotes of more than that and less.



Sanctuary Carpet/Cushions:

The carpet in the Sanctuary has lived a good life, as it is original to the Sanctuary. The carpet is showing more and more wear, and it is badly faded in front of the windows (the new windows will have UV protection, which should prevent future fading). The cushions are also worn and will be replaced to match the carpet. We assess from quotes and planning done in recent years that this portion of the project can be completed for \$25,000 or less.



Flooring in the Fellowship Hall and kitchen:

The glue-down, vinyl tiles in the Fellowship Hall and kitchen are badly worn and some are coming loose. Due to wear, the floors in this space are also difficult to keep clean. The flooring needs to be removed and replaced with a better quality of more durable material that can withstand the beating it receives in a high traffic area of a church that is on the move. We have quotes for demo, disposal, and replacement of the floors in this area of \$25,000 and less. *(Continued on Page 2)*

It's important that we're clear on how the work will begin and progress. We will not begin the Sanctuary window work until the total for that portion of the project has been raised. Likewise, the carpet and cushions will be replaced only when that portion is raised, and so on. Our goal is to have all of the funding in place and all of the work either completed or in process within one year.

Church, we have children and youth in our community, in our neighborhoods, right in our own flock that are homeless. This heartbreaking fact is something I was shocked to hear. These children and their circumstances aren't easily recognizable. It may not be obvious to us, but it's real for many children in Berkeley County. So, our Mission and Evangelism Ministry Team is partnering with the people who have a relationship with these children – people who can recognize the signs and are trained to help. We are partnering with the guidance counselors at Berkeley Middle School. Throughout November, join us in praying.....

Students without a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence can be considered homeless under the McKinney-Vento law. This includes:

- living with a friend, relative or someone else because of losing their home due to temporary financial problems;
- staying in a motel, hotel, trailer park, or campground, because they have nowhere else to go;
- living in a shelter, including emergency or transitional shelter, domestic violence shelter, and run away homeless shelters;
- staying in substandard housing, living in places not ordinarily used for sleeping, including cars, parks, public places, abandoned buildings, or bus or train stations;
- abandoned in a hospital.

An Unaccompanied Homeless Youth is a youth who meets the criteria above and also is not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian.
