Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. I Thessalonians 5:16-18 (ESV)

Brothers and Sisters,

Let's take a moment to rejoice about our church's Restoration Project. You'll recall about this time last year, we presented a plan to replace the Sanctuary windows, Sanctuary carpet, and the flooring in the Fellowship Hall and Kitchen. The budget to perform this work totaled about \$100,000, and we began to raise those funds.

To date, we have completed all of these projects as well as adding the following:

- -Repaired water damage to ceiling in sanctuary and completely repainted the entire sanctuary
- -Removed faded endcaps from pews and had them professionally refinished
 - -Repainted the Narthex and Foyer
- -Repainted the Fellowship Hall
- -Replaced flooring in the hallway through the children's Sunday school wing

Even after adding the above, the total amount we have spent is \$87,338. While we haven't yet received all of the funds that were pledged to the project, we have roughly \$4,402 remaining in the restoration fund after all expenses incurred to date. This money can be used toward projects like replacing the flooring in the rooms along the children's hallway and/or placing the same flooring in the opposing carpeted hallway once the remaining pledges are in.

We can't talk about the Restoration Project without mentioning God's timing. Certainly God didn't plan the pandemic just for our church, but what great timing! Think about it! We had just raised all the funds we needed to restore our church – then the pandemic forced us to shut everything down, and then hold services outside. While we all wish we could be worshipping inside, this was the ideal opportunity to do all the work we had just gathered the funding for, and because we didn't have to work around the services and daily life in the church, we were able to accomplish what we planned and more with the funds that were gathered. If anyone has ever lived through a major home renovation, you can appreciate how much it impacts you when you are living in your home. Paul said we should give thanks in everything, and we are thank-ful that if we had to shut our church down for a pandemic, it couldn't have come at a better time. God has a plan for everything! Thanks to all who have given to and worked on the Restoration Project.

Now it is time to turn our attention to 2021, and our Stewardship plans for next year. COVID-19 was certainly not something any of us planned for this year. We were facing a lot of financial uncertainty earlier this year, not knowing how this pandemic would affect our congregation's ability to fulfill their pledges, and not knowing what our services would look like or how the changes would impact other offerings that go to help us cover our budgeted expenses. But we trusted God. Intentionally. Our income is covering our expenses this year, and we are hopeful that trend will continue through the remainder of 2020.

We don't know what 2021 will bring us, but we do know that we will continue to have the (continued on page 2)

operating expenses that it takes to run a church. Our budget for 2020 is \$450,000. Here is a breakdown of where your money went in 2020:

your money went in 2020.	
Salaries (Pastor & Staff)	60%
Operating Expenses (Utilities, Mortgage, Supplies, Maintenance)	25%
Missions	7%
Education, Nurture, and Pastoral Care	5%
Worship, Evangelism, and Fellowship	2%
Presbytery	2%

Our church's expenses are similar to what each of you face when running a household, and the pandemic has not changed many of those expenses. The majority of our expenses are for salaries, and for running our "household", and not much can be done to reduce those costs. It is important that we continue and even increase our pledges. Our goal is to expand our ability to serve others within our church, but primarily outside of our church in the missions area. Our missions budget has been cut from 38,000 in 2017 to \$26,000 in 2020. **Our challenge to you is to increase pledges enough to give 10% of our income to missions every year.**

As we begin the 2021 Stewardship season, please thoughtfully consider what you and your family can pledge to give to support the church next year. Your generous contributions have allowed us to restore our church, and we can't wait to be able to worship inside again. Please continue your generous support as you fill out the at-tached pledge card for 2021. If you prefer, just call or email the church office to designate your pledge for 2021.

Once you've made your pledge, please consider setting up your giving on-line. We don't believe in coincidences, so when God challenged us to set up on-line giving late last year, He was preparing us for the new normal that we live in today, where so much of what we do is virtual. If you haven't yet, the SPF encourages you to check out how easy it is to give your pledges and offerings on line! You can even designate them to go to a particular fund if you wish. Go to the Church's website and look for Giving, or download the Breeze App and set up your account for First Presbyterian Church of Moncks Corner. You can also call Lisa Kelly at the church, and she will show you how easy and safe it is to donate on-line.

Thank you all for your generous support this year, and God bless you all as we move into 2021.

Minutes in a Minute

On Wednesday, September 16 the Session of First Presbyterian Church conducted a Special Meeting:

- We opened with prayer led by Pastor Timothy.
- We approved and authorized a sub-committee to put together a plan for hosting the Berkeley High School football breakfast in accordance with the church's COVID-19 Return to Worship Plan and BCSD district policy. The committee was given authority to draft and execute a plan on be half of the session. This committee consists of Don Cribb, Rick Ollic, Angeline Brock, Chris Wilson, and a representative from BHS or BCSD.
- We adjourned with prayer.

On Monday, September 21, the Session of First Presbyterian Church:

- Opened with silence and prayer.
- Reported on the results from the "Pain Point and Church Charism Survey" individually conducted by each elder with 3-5 non-church members in the community. This listening exercise is intended to help us grow our capacity to listen to the needs of our community and discern how our church might respond.
- Received feedback from Sunday School Classes about steps toward our "Return to In-Person Worship" plan.
- Voted to move to Phase 3 (see opposite page) of our "Return to In-Person Worship Plan" and updated the room capacity of the plan (11 for the BASIC room, Library, and Pearl Leland room)
- Set a date of Sunday, October 11 to resume Sunday worship in the sanctuary at 11:30am. This time will allow for transition from the 9am service (which will remain outside) and accommodate the time needed for deeper spiritual formation taking place during Sunday School.
- Received reports from the Stewardship, Personnel, and Finance Team (pledge dedication Sunday will be October 25), Restoration Project Team (see details in front page article), Hospitality Team (Elder Gene Williams provided an updated Visitor's List), and Pastoral Care.
- Received the report from the Pastor (including vacation request) and began the conversation concerning his Summer 2021 Sabbatical. Elder Gene Williams agreed to serve on the Sabbatical Planning Team (which will include approval of the Pastor's Spiritual Renewal plans and the coverage for the congregation in his absence).

Adjourned the meeting with prayer by Elder Rin Page.
