A Note From Out Pastor


A voice of one calling: "In the wilderness prepare the way for the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain. And the glory of the Lord will be revealed, and all people will see it together. For the mouth of the Lord has spoken.

-Isaiah 40:3-5

I think we can all agree that 2020 has been rough. If you're like me, you're ready to be D.O.N.E. with it. Some of us are thinking, *can the ball drop already, and we just move on to 2021?* Well, what if the Season of Advent is exactly what we need as 2020 draws to a close. On the one hand,

Advent is the beginning of new liturgical calendar, so technically, it's a loop hole, and we can say that we've already moved on to the next year ②. However, and more seriously, the themes of Advent are exactly what we need in the midst of all this disruption.

Advent is about longing, anticipation, yearning. Advent means "coming." It's a time when we acknowledge the holy discontent we have this side of Christ's return. Drawing on the words of Isaiah, we realize that the path isn't straight, that the mountains are steep, the valleys are low, and the rough ground is just too rugged for our weary feet. We take time to name it. In our immediate-gratification world, Advent tells us to counter-culturally wait.



The world around us will rush to celebrate Christ-less sentimentality which some have come to call "Christmas." It too realizes things are not the way they ought to be, but the world tells us that shopping straightens the path, or entertainment will level the way, or a party could light the darkness. However, as disciples of Jesus, we wait, knowing he alone is the answer, so we long for the day when "the glory of the Lord will be revealed." We don't rush to a Christ-less Christmas. We celebrate Advent. We pray, "Come, Lord Jesus."

Some Spiritual Disciplines to consider as we wait:

- 1. The Jesse Tree: This is a modest evergreen, with an ornament to hang each day of Advent. The ornaments correspond with Old Testament stories leading up to the birth of Christ. I love this practice because every year its roots me again in Scripture and the hope we have in the coming Messiah
- **2.** Advent Candles: Sure, we light these on Sunday morning in worship, but I would encourage you to light advent candles at home. While the darkness grows around us, we light a candle in anticipation of Christ, the Light who shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome.
- **3.** Acts of Kindness Advent Calendar: You'll find this custom calendar in this newsletter. Our Butterfly Mission Team, put together 4 weeks of kind actions we can take every day leading up to Christmas. This is a way to live incarnationally as we look to Christ's incarnation. A way to be a light as we anticipate THE light. (Page 2)



On Monday, November 16, the Session of First Presbyterian Church:

- Opened with prayer and devotion from Luke 18
- Examine and approved the following officers: William Tanner (Deacon), Troy Cribb (Deacon), Clisha Weathers (Deacon), John Spencer (Elder), Doris Partlow (Elder), and David Harris (Elder)
- Set January 23 as the date for the Officers' Retreat and meeting of the College of Elders
- Set January 24 as the date for the ordination and installation of new officers
- Conducted a first reading of the budget, and resolved to encourage the congregation to reconsider their 2021 pledges
- Authorized the Worship Ministry Team to determine the schedule for the Christmas Eve worship services
- Received update from Rev. Scoonover's doctoral work: nearing completion of his third year of studies, and looking to begin the project phase of his work in January
- Received reports from the Stewardship, Personnel, and Finance Team (pledge dedication Sunday was October 25), Hospitality Team (Elder Gene Williams provided an updated Visitor's List), Butterfly Ministry (reaching out to young adults), and Pastoral Care
