We had a successful effort in supplying bags of food for needy families and elderly folks in Berkeley County. Your donations allowed us to fill 152 bags with enough food to last several days for individuals and small families:

- 25 bags went to Berkeley Seniors (Meals of Wheels recipients)
- 15 bags for Cordesville Baptist
- 30 bags for a St. Stephen Church
- 30 bags for Bethlehem Baptist in Alvin
- 10 bags went to a new outreach in Cross
- 37 bags went to a grammar school in Goose Creek with 80% of children on government assistance.

Thank you for your support of this program. Sally, our church secretary, did receive a phone call from a gentleman that was so appreciative of receiving the bag. He said his wife had passed away a few months ago and this food bag meant so much to him. Although we receive few direct expressions of thanks, those that distribute the bags tell us that many recipients are teary eyed when they get our gifts. All of us that work on this ministry are grateful that we have the opportunity to serve our community.
