

A Note from Our Sabbatical Team

"For six years sow your fields, and for six years prune your vineyards and gather their crops.

But in the seventh year the land is to have a year of sabbath rest, a sabbath to the Lord." -Leviticus 25:3-5 (NIV)



Pastor Timothy has completed a little over seven years of ministry at our church, so the session has voted for him to have a three-month sabbatical this summer. In order to prepare, the session has commissioned the following team: Gene Williams (chair), Don Cribb, and Laurie Carter. We would like to use this space to explain some of the details.

What is a sabbatical?

It's rooted in our understanding of Creation and God's resting on the seventh day. Sabbath literally means to "cease" or "stop." This practice gets expanded through the Old Testament to include years, see the Leviticus reference above. But fear not, Timothy is not taking an entire year off. But, as our Presbytery suggests, he'll be taking three months off this summer. "The purpose of the Sabbatical Policy is to provide, in cooperation with the sessions of the congregations involved, an opportunity for full-time professional staff members to spend three months away from the parish for the purpose of study, rest, and travel" (Charleston-Atlantic Presbytery Sabbatical Policy, May 2006).

What to expect for Timothy

Pastor Timothy will be away June 7 – August 31. His session-approved proposal includes: travel with and worship with his family, study and review of his doctoral materials, and focus on spiritual disciplines. The cost of Timothy's portion of sabbatical will be entirely covered by his continuing education allowance. Please be praying for his rest and growth... that he may know that he's not an *employee for God*, but a *child of God*.

What to expect for the church

This is a gift to our church, as much as it is to Timothy. It's an opportunity to for us to reset, to see the various gifts in our congregation, and celebrate God's work and provision in and through our church. In Timothy's absence, the Sabbatical Team is (continued on page 2)

working to cover both the Teaching Ministry and Pastoral Care for our congregation.

As for the Teaching Ministry, Sunday mornings won't skip a beat. We will be welcoming several mission partners throughout the summer: Sherry Schumann (Grandparenting Ministry), Clint Echols (FCA), David Ensor (Hope Repair), Tron Severe (Healing Farms), and many more. We will also hear testimonies and ministries from within our church—like GriefShare and our budding Soup Kitchen. We will keep you informed of the schedule as the summer gets closer, but we can assure you, you won't want to miss a Sunday.

As for Pastoral Care, the Pastoral Care Team—led by Doris Partlow—will be overseeing the pastoral needs of our church. Our congregation excels at caring for one another, and we are confident this will continue over the summer. In the event of a pastoral emergency or an emergency or a funeral, the Sabbatical Team has secured an "on-call" Commissioned Lay Pastor through our presbytery named Bo Hamilton. Pastor Bo is currently serving as the Supply Pastor at the Cane Bay Presbyterian Church. While he won't be part of our "daily operations," we are blessed to know that we do have pastoral care coverage if there are needs beyond the scope of our typical congregational care.

We cannot emphasize enough, the opportunity this presents to our congregation and our pastor. We trust God's rejuvenating work in Timothy and our church, as we are mutually restored to our calling and spiritual health. To God be the Glory!

Weekend Lock In Discipleship Retreat April 16th-18th




The Youth have been invited to participate in this year's D(iscipleship) Now Weekend.
