A Note From Our Pastor

"...and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross." -Colossians 1:20

Four years ago, I used this space to share about our family's annual trip to the Mepkin Abbey Crèche Festival. I know I run the risk of repeating myself, but the experience is just so moving, that I'd like to share about it again this year.



Our family loves nativities. We've even started our own little crèche collection over the years. A couple are more traditional, some are more abstract. One, a friend brought back from a mission trip to Africa. Another, made out of a coconut, my brother gave us from his work in Haiti. So, you can image our delight in the annual Mepkin Abbey Festival. I'm sharing this display below because it spoke to me about *unity*.

I hope you can tell from the picture that entire nativity scene is presented from ONE solid piece of wood. If there's a name for this type of continuous cut, I don't know it. I do know enough about woodworking to truly admire it, though. (My grandfather was commissioned to carve an ornament for the Christmas tree at the White House!). I'm amazed at the precision of the artist. The risk—one wrong turn of the blade and a whole angel gets left out of the scene. So, every "character" in the scene was already present in the same log. Mary, Joseph, the Magi, and Jesus were all cut out of the same wood. All intact. All connected. Unity.

There's so much that is splintering us apart right now. Our world seems just as fractured as ever. The trouble is, it's not just the world that's splintering. Division is even stoked within the church.

Along comes this log... the only one who can bring true and lasting unity is Jesus. The one who brings unity, depicted in a unified carving. To be clear, I don't mean the "can't we all just get along" kind of unity. That's shallow and doesn't do justice to the differences present in our diverse world. The gritty, lasting unity of Christ comes by way of another log—his cross. It's a unity purchased by his suffering and sacrifice. In the words of Paul, Jesus' reconciling peace comes by the blood of the cross.

You are likely to see a lot of nativities over the next four weeks. I hope they cause us pause and ponder. This Advent, may we see with fresh eyes Christ—the *One* who makes us *one*.
