# Soup Kitchen Update



Several weeks ago, a woman from Bonneau wrote to the cooks of the church expressing her thoughts for the meals we take her twice a month. She said that the man who delivered them told her that they were delivered in God's love and she accepts them with the same spirit. Many people express their gratitude when they receive meals and several have donated money to help defray our costs.

We made our first delivery to Shannonwood and St. Francis communities in May 2021 and serve them every second and fourth Tuesday of the month. Our spaghetti and salad meal seems to be the most popular and we also furnish meals of chicken, pork loin, and ham along with bread and two vegetables.

Currently we have three cook teams and three delivery teams that work hard to provide meals with our message of serving our community. To help with our meal delivery, several ladies from Grace Reformed Episcopal Church have volunteered and are great assets to our St. Francis outreach.

Our funding is provided by \$4,000 in the church budget and gifts from the congregation. We also received a \$1,000 grant from Walmart and soon will apply for another one. In the last 12 months, we have provided almost 2,800 meals. Our expenditures have been \$2,522, which includes the cost of containers.

In 2022, we hope to expand our program into another community as time and personnel allow. We are indeed grateful for the support given us by this congregation. God has certainly blessed this effort.



