A Note from Our Pastor

Stewardship 2023

I lit a candle in my office this morning. I didn't pay much attention to the scent, but as the day went on, everyone who walked by seemed to conclude, "I smell Christmas." Then, it dawned on me. I looked over, and sure enough, I lit the Fresh Balsam Christmas candle. Oops. No, I'm not one who wants to skip over pumpkins and pilgrims and start listening to Christmas Carols in October. In my calendar, each season has its proper place. And I'm not here to judge the appropriate time to put up Christmas decorations (clears throat, after Thanksgiving). I simply want to note that something in each of us that *longs* for Christmas. We yearn for Emmanuel—God with us. We all desperately want a with-God life. So, when God does show up to be WITH us (i.e. Christmas), we rejoice! Life with God is the free gift offered to us when we place our trust in Jesus. Theologians call this union with Christ. We are in Christ, and Christ is in us. This is foundational in our Christian faith, and this will be our focus in the upcoming stewardship season – Union with Christ.

For stewardship season, we are continuing in the Gospel of Luke, and we'll get a deep-dive in what it means to be in union with Christ. Here's a sample of what we'll hear...


> Jesus sent them... where he himself was about to go. Luke 10:1 Jesus said, "The one who hears you, hears me." Luke 10:16 Jesus said, "Rejoice that your names are written in heaven." Luke 10:20

"The LIFE WITH God posture is predicated on the view that relationship is at the core of

Each of these verses reveals deep solidarity and association with Christ. We go where Christ goes. We say what Christ says. We rejoice that, when we trust in him, he seals us for eternity. We have union with Christ. Skye Jethani, in his book With: Reimagining the Way You Relate to God, describes it this way:

the cosmos: God the Father with God the Son with God the Holy Spirit. And so we

should not be surprised to discover that when God desired to restore humanity's broken relationship with him, he sent his Son to dwell with us. His plan to restore his creation was not to send a list of rules and rituals to follow (LIFE UNDER GOD), nor was it the implementation of useful principles (LIFE OVER GOD). He did not send a genie to grant us our desires (LIFE FROM GOD), nor did he give us a task to accomplish (LIFE FOR GOD). Instead God himself came to be with us—to walk with us once again as he had done in Eden in the beginning. Jesus entered into our dark existence to share our broken world and to illuminate a different way forward... a life WITH God. (Jethani, 101)



Our union with Christ shapes the way we pray, serve, go, and give. Life with God changes everything. So, for Stewardship 2023, we will spend three weeks in October exploring our Union with Christ and how it opens us to greater generosity.

Begin now reflecting on the security and belonging you have in Christ. Notice how this frees you to live a more generous life. Pray over your time, your budget, and your skills, asking God to show you how each offers an opportunity to partner with Him in Kingdom work.


GriefShare is a support group that meets weekly. It is a warm, caring environment that you will find as an "oasis" on your long journey through grief.


