Wednesday Prayer Gathering – Moncks Corner and Beyond

Every Wednesday we gather at 11 a.m. and we intercede on behalf of those we love. I have had the opportunity to travel to Mexico and partner in the cistern ministry so there are people in Mexico very dear to my heart. On many occasions I find myself bringing the names and needs of our Mexican brothers and sisters to the group. One name I have lifted several times over the past two years is a young man name Ezekiel. He is the grandson of the foreman (Victor) and one of the partners in this cistern ministry. In 2020 Ezekiel began to have heart trouble that prevented him from working. As I sought updates the news continued to look grim; good doctors are hard to come by and money to afford those doctors is even harder. So, we continued to pray.

Mexico Cistern Ministry - More Than Water

Prayer unites believers in a way that is truly a mystery. When we stepped onto the first worksite this past July, there was Ezekiel strong and healthy. Healed! I was in awe! (And of course, I

cried happy tears). I couldn't wait to share with the prayer team because I knew they would rejoice like their very own brother or son had been restored! They'd never met him, but through prayer and the work of the Holy Spirit believers are family.



During my first trip to Mexico, I thought I was going to give families access to clean water, and we do, but we also receive when we go! We receive a global family. Our faith is strengthened, and our amazement of God grows as we see how He knits us together across borders.

Hands of Christ – Speaking The Same Language

The morning of Thursday, August 4 we received a knock at the church door. A man and his son had traveled from North Charleston with a flyer about Hands of Christ. The time was not included on their flyer. They were 5 hours early. The little boy did not speak English. The man spoke very little. And I speak very, very little Spanish, so we relied on the one language we both knew – the Language of Jesus – patience, grace, and a big smile. We tried to communicate with the few words we knew, and with patience and grace God winked at us when I learned they were from Guatemala. I was then able to share with the man that I had just returned from a trip very close to the Mexican/Guatemalan border. God was knitting us together with this tiny detail we had in common. We were able to get the little boy school supplies and two outfits. As they turned to leave, the father asked if our worship services were ever in Spanish because they wanted to return. As I had to tell him no, I thought, "maybe this is something for our prayer team to pray over."

I will be in a pluralistic environment with certain restrictions placed upon me on how to minister due to the dual hat I have to wear as a minister and an Army officer at the same time.

Also, prayer for the Lord's favor with the unit that I will be ministering to as well as power to help bring the Gospel to them. I can continue to give updates on what the Lord is doing through our ministry as a chaplain and would still love to come and visit with the body at Moncks Corner as we are able to do so.



Dear Presbytery of the Midwest and all our supporters,

It is with a heavy heart that Lyndsay and I must make this announcement. Our steering committee met back in March 2022 to determine the vitality of Three Taverns Community Church Plant. During several waves of different Covid-19 variants we have had to continue to navigate how one can plant a church during the pandemic. While I do believe we overcame several hurdles and made much progress in that time, the pandemic continued to grant us great challenges as finances, networking, and organization of our plant continued to become a challenge. Many people that we know through V3 (a coaching church planting network), had to close their doors. We hung on longer than most in these networks which was encouraging.

With the recent wave this past winter, the challenge became greater and the timeframe for us to plant a church continued to drag on. We kept saying to our selves, "Let's give it a few more months and see what happens." But it was increasingly difficult to regain momentum.

A plant can take 3-6 years pre-pandemic, now you are looking at 8-15 years if not longer. We, as a committee, felt it was wise that our supporters begin to direct their giving to other more sustainable ministries as good stewards of our finances. We began to inform churches at the beginning of this year that it is looking more and more likely that the plant will have to close its doors.

The steering committee had decided that while the seeds planted in Dutchtown have grown much fruit, the garden has become too hard to maintain. We will officially be closing our doors this month.

We have seen the Lord's hand at work in our ministry here, and Lyndsay and I will stay put in the neighborhood for the time being and continue to minister to the people with whom we have relationships. But we will not be formally pursing any type of official plant at this time.

We will use this season to continue to evaluate where the Lord may be directing us next and focus on our personal growth.

We have seen so much fruit in the work here and none of that would have been possible if it weren't for you all! We are so thankful and have been truly blessed by your support. Continue to pray for us during this time, that we can evaluate where the Lord is directing us and evaluate how to continue to care for those around us.

We love you all and look forward to continuing our relationships and staying in touch!


