A Note from Our Pastor

A word about what's new in 2023 Fuller Formation Groups

Our journey into Fuller Formation Groups (FFG) starts at last year's officers' retreat. So rewind to January of 2022. During that gathering—over Zoom because of the weather—our leadership targeted the #1 growth area for our church as: **Making Disciples.** It's in our mission statement. It's what we say we're about. It's what Jesus says we should be about, "Go and make disciples" (Matt 28). But the leaders were honestly asking, *Are we really making disciples?* So, over the course of the 2022 we prayed, searched, and questioned. If we want to **MAKE disciples**, then we're going to have to **BE disciples.** It starts with our leadership. We need to foster a discipleship culture among our leaders. That's when we came across a year-long program out of Fuller Theological Seminary

called Fuller Formation Groups. In the fall of 2022, our session voted to begin a partnership with FFG.

FULLER CENTER FOR SPIRITUAL FORMATION

The program gives us access to some of the best spiritual formation teachers in the world, as they shepherd us into a deeper walk with Jesus over the course of the year.

Purpose:

Flourishing Discipleship

Content:

The curriculum centers around practices to help disciples flourish: in union with God, in relationship with God's people, and on mission with God in the world. These spiritual practices are varied, adaptive, and communal. Throughout the year we will "try on" various practices—some ancient and some contemporary—and reflect on those practices in small groups.

Format:

The material is anchored by four retreats (January, May, August, and December). A trained mentor from Fuller travels Moncks Corner to lead these (our leader is Drew Smith from Texas, he was fantastic!). Then, between retreats, we have a four-week rhythm of: Learning, Doing, Reflecting, and Relating. First, we learn about a practice. This is web-based, so that we're able to learn from Fuller experts on that particular practice via their online platform. The next week we actually *do* the practice. The third week, we reflect about how it's going. Lastly, we share about our experience within our small group (these are groups of four which were determined at the first retreat).

Participation:

Space is limited to 25 spots, so for this pilot year, we only opened it up the elders and deacons of the church. However, next year, it will be open to **ANYONE** in the congregation. So, let us know if you're interested. We've already got names on the list for 2024!

I've included some pictures of our first retreat. We were at Mepkin Abbey on January 27-28. Along with an introduction to the program, delicious food (thanks Harrises and Wortens!), and getting to know one another and Drew, we began with the practices of "Retreat of Silence," "Communal Reading of Scripture" (Mark 1-4), and "Small Group Reflection and Prayer."

So, now when you hear about Fuller Formation Groups, you've got a little background. I'd love to share more if you have any questions or interest. I'm sure you'll be hearing more throughout the year. I'm hopeful this will help us foster a culture of discipleship here at FPC.



Henry Bonner Memorial Offering

Sunday, February 19 & 26

Sunday, February 19 and 26, we will have the annual Henry Bonner Memorial offering. Special envelopes will be available in the atrium or you can designate it for this special offering on your check. All funds collected will go to support the Habitat for Humanity in Berkeley County. Mr. Bonner had a long and distinguished career in public education, serving as a coach, teacher, principal, and eventually, as Superintendent of Schools for Berkeley County in 1959. He served in this position for nearly 30 years, retiring just before Hurricane Hugo in 1989. The Henry E. Bonner Elementary School in Macedonia was named in his honor. After his retirement, he became active as a volunteer in many civic endeavors, and chaired the Habitat for Humanity effort which was just beginning in Berkeley County. Henry died on July 3, 2007. The session wanted to remember Henry in a way that would honor him. Because his influence was so important in getting Habitat for Humanity started in Berkeley County, it was decided that a memorial offering would take place annually in February, with the funds designated to support Habitat for Humanity that was so important to Henry. *Please give generously*.
